

ADMINISTRATORS MESSAGE



St. John XXIII encouraged us not to concern ourselves with our failures but rather with what is still possible for us to accomplish. Please help me to remember that with you all things are possible.







Foods

Students will build on skills learned in the previous grades. These include simple food preparation to more complex food planning and preparation. In grade nine, cultural foods are examined, and nutrition is an integral part of their food planning.



Instrumental Music Grade 6-9

Students will learn to play a wind or brass instrument while performing different styles of music. Public performances occur throughout the year. Public performances occur two times a year.



Career & Technology Foundations (CTF)

Our students spend a significant amount of time in the online environment every day for both personal and academic reasons. We want our students to navigate safely and ethically in the digital world to prepare them for job opportunities and success in the global economy. They will be given opportunities to explore areas of interest and passions as they attempt using various media, audio, and video production.

French as a Second Language

Students will study French as a Second Language, according to the Alberta Curriculum. Students who continue through the three years of junior high French will have the opportunity to go into an advanced class in high school. Focus is on both the spoken language as well as writing/grammar.

Drama

Students will be actively involved in a variety of projects and assignments that would include creative movement, mime, stage fighting, choral speech, improvisation, theatre sports, puppetry, film, reader's theatre, scripted work audition pieces, and video and stage productions. This is a performance-based class where the students will be expected to perform in front of audiences.

Art and Design

Art classes give students the opportunity to do many creative projects and work with different types of media. Projects and media include sketching, mark making, abstracts, portraits, pastels, watercolors, wire sculptures, clay work, and collages. Students will also be given the opportunity to design furniture and learn about fashion!



Construction and Design

Students will develop skills in using common hand tools and machines to design and construct basic woodworking and glass projects. Emphasis is placed on woodworking, but students will also build their own projects. Students will be introduced to new machines and techniques with an emphasis placed on construction of more difficult projects.



Recreational Leadership

Students will explore the different aspects of leadership with a focus on sports and active living. There will be many opportunities to go out and do fieldwork as well as have guest speakers.

Athletics Program

We offer a complete athletics program to our Junior High students. We have teams for both boys and girls. We offer senior and junior teams for Volleyball and Basketball. School Programs Offered

At École St. John XXIII School we offer a dual track French Immersion Program from Kindergarten to Grade 9. Our French Immersion students are taught by teachers who are training in the Diplôme d'Études en Langue Française (DELF) certificates program which is offered in partnership with the Centre International d'Études Pédagogiques, in France and the French Embassy in Canada. This specialized training allows St. John XXIII to offer a French Immersion Program run by highly specialized teachers who process a deep understanding of French Language acquisition skills.

The Diplôme d'Études en Langue Française (DELF):

- is consistent with the Common European Framework of Reference for Languages (CEFR).
- allows learners to measure their level of achievement at a specific level of competency versus all student worldwide studying the same language.
- gives learners greater possibilities to further their mastery of a second language on a lifelong basis.

It is the second most widely learned language after English and the sixth most widely spoken language in the world. French is also the second mostly widely taught language after

- Students who have early musical training will develop areas of the brain related to language and reasoning. The left side of the brain is better developed with music, and songs can help imprint information on young minds.
- Even when performing with sheet music, student musicians are constantly using their memory to perform.
- Students who practice with musical instruments can improve their hand-eye coordination, just like playing sports, children can develop motor skills when playing music.
- Students learn pattern recognition for math and pattern-recognition skills
- It has shown to improve academic skills, physical skills, cultivate social skills, refine discipline and patience.
- Students show improved language development, increased IQ as the brain must engage multiple senses to learn music.

Activities
